Jerusalem Trio arrive

White Rock Baptist hosts classical musicians

Internationally-acclaimed classical musicians the Jerusalem Trio will bring their music to White Rock this Friday, (March 11) with a concert at White Rock Baptist Church.

The 8 p.m. concert is part of the sold-out White Rock Concerts subscription series.

Works by Haydn, Ravel and Beethoven's 'Archduke' trio will be performed by the group, all of whom are faculty members of the Rubin Academy at Jerusalem Hebrew University.

Formed in Israel in 1989, the group began their working career under the auspices of the Jerusalem Music Centre, founded by the late Isaac Stern, and have become Israel's leading piano trio.

The group's thoughtful and passionate music making has won rave reviews in both recordings and in live performances throughout the U.S., Canada, Japan, Europe, Australia, New Zealand and South America.

They have also collaborated with many renowned artists, including Stern, Pinchas Zukerman and Shlomo Mintz.

They were first-prize winners at the 1999

Osaka International Chamber Music Competition, and were prize winners at the 1995 Melbourne International Competition.

Individually, they are all America-Israel Cultural Foundation scholarship winners.

The trio's orchestral engagements have included concerts with the Israel Philharmonic, the Calgary Philharmonic, the Santiago Philharmonic and the Camerata Virtuosi.

Festival appearances have included the Pro-Festival and Insel Hombroich in Germany, Kfar Blum in Israel, the Dubrovnik festival in Croatia and the Banff Festival in Canada.

White Rock Concerts, just short of celebrating its 50th year in operation, has been termed by CBC Radio "one of the the three great success stories in classical music in North America."

Highly sought subscriptions for the next White Rock Concerts season, to be announced in April, will be available to the general public May 1, after being first offered to current subscribers.
